FROM PASTOR REBECCA

Dear sisters and brothers,

As many of you know, my new schedule at church took effect January 1. This, along with a few other changes in how we function, is part of the approved mission proposal for 2016. While there is a short general announcement in the bulletin each week about this, given the number of questions I have received about how all of this will work, I thought it might be good to use this space to address those questions.

First, I will be honest. This transition is hard not just for you, but for me too. In fact there have been a couple of Monday mornings I have started the drive to church after taking Silas to daycare and had to quickly remind myself I wasn’t going in for the day. While I have had some great help from various people taking on some of the responsibilities I have managed in the past, it still at times feels like there is more to get done in the days I am here than time allows. Hopefully as the weeks go on, I will come to know better what to expect during a normal week and can arrange my days accordingly. But for a while, I can almost guarantee things might take a little longer for me to accomplish or do. And it may be longer than you are used to for a reply from me concerning church issues. Once I have a better sense of the rhythm of my days, I will let you know that as well.

My Sabbath day continues to be Friday during the week, but I have now also been given off one additional day during the week. Usually this day will occur on Mondays so Linda and I can continue to work well together, but if for some reason it needs to change due to other circumstances, it will be published in the bulletin the Sunday before. You can also always call the office to check or send an email. Speaking of email, in order to help me with my own boundaries around not working when I shouldn’t, be prepared to begin seeing an automatic response from my email on my days off. If your email requires an immediate response or is concerning an emergency, please choose to call or text me instead.

A few other pieces are still in the transition process, like figuring out what my one Sunday a month will look like, what additional responsibilities might be shared by others, and how we as a church can staff well for our needs. But all in good time. There are also many great people working on this transition and visioning process with me and it has delighted me to watch people step up to take on responsibilities at church., including imagining new ministries for this place that helps us to live what it means to be church to our community. So thank you for that! Feel free to ask questions of me along the way and we will figure this thing out together!

KEEPING YOU INFORMED

The council meeting on January 17th began at 12:15PM with 10 members present. Pastor led us in devotions. There was no **Secretary's Report** because we didn't meet last month. **Pastor's report:** She had 18 pastoral visits, no hospital visits or funerals, and 3 couples for marriage. Lenten planning has begun and we will gather at 6:30 for dinner together with a prayer service and guided conversations to follow. These conversations will be built around the FoPoP meetings and our vision for the future. The transitioning piece has been going well with different people taking over different responsibilities. If you are interested in helping, please see a member of Council. Looking into possibly forming a group to rotate to visit our shut in members. The report was accepted. **Financial report:** Through November there has been a huge difference in giving –for the better! Since September there has been an increase in giving along with some special gifts. We are -\$3,273 through November and will be close to breaking even for the end of the year. The report was accepted.

Parish Life: Buffalo Night is coming up on January 30th. Discussed Lenten services and what they will look like. Raised \$50 for UNICEF! Youth Sunday is January 31st, please plan on joining us to support our youth! **Parish Outreach:** Advent Extravaganza went well and the neighbors we met were excited to receive bags. Meeting this week to plan for the year. **Parish Support:** No report.

Unfinished business: Audit in progress. 50th Anniversary celebration was nice and ornaments are still available!

New business: Working on who handles personnel matters such as job descriptions, reviews, procedures, etc. The Cantalician Center approached Pastor about using the building Monday through Friday (mostly as a meeting point before they go volunteer within the community) and after discussing issues/space usage (for example when there is a funeral), a motion was made and carried to open our building to their organization. A spring meat raffle is in the works, watch for information coming soon!

The meeting adjourned at 12:55PM.

The second annual Bishop's Convocation will be held, Saturday, March 12, 2016 at St. Michael's Lutheran Church in Camillus. Kevin Strickland, executive for worship and assistant to the ELCA presiding bishop. Strickland will lead us through conversations focusing on the "Means of Grace": how do we offer it, care for it and receive it? How do these gifts of grace help shape our liturgy and lives of study and prayer? What are the biggest challenges facing worship today? In an ever-changing world, how do we as church leaders continue to offer these "Means of Grace," inviting all into these as gifts and not legalistic prescriptions to our faith?
