

FROM PASTOR REBECCA

Because the truth is, this is not a time to kill ourselves with being perfect, but rather it is a time to recognize that it is exactly because we aren't that God came to live and walk among us.



KEEPING YOU INFORMED

Meeting called to order at 7:06. Present: Pastor Rebecca, Dave Freund, Bob Barzycki, Eileen Kiener, Mike Freas, John Kling, Debbie LaBounty, Denise Myers and Alex Suto. Absent: Don Fuerst.

Pastor's report: 2 hospital visits, 0 funerals, 2 upcoming Baptisms and 18 pastoral visits. Went for training on Coordinator of candidacy position. Met with the bishop on NYS sexual harassment law implications and what that means for the synod and individual congregations. A letter will be sent out with sample policy to all congregations. Pastor will travel to Utica to discuss implementation of these policies in their area. The POP newsletter deadline is fast approaching and submissions are due soon. December 3rd will be our second quarterly planning meeting and all are encouraged to attend. Her intern supervision begins this month. Giving statements and letter were sent out. FoPoP included a post card soliciting opinions on the single service. Comments continue to come in and will be reviewed by FoPoP and info forwarded to the Council. Marion Wolbert has decided to retire from the Baptismal banner committee. Looking for a volunteer to take over. Church cleaning and decorating set for December 8 at 9 am. All are welcome to help. Pastor will be traveling to for the Thanksgiving holiday and on a staycation the following week. Deacon Paul Moon will do the Sunday service and Pastor Deb Turley is available for emergencies. A motion to accept the report was made by Denise and seconded by Bob. Carried.

Unfinished business: Audits: Debi Donogher hopes to have them all finished by March 31, 2019. Organ update: deposit check has been cashed and delivery is expected in mid-December. Membership Conversation: council members awaiting report on the single service comment cards. Printer/copier: 4 bids were reviewed by the council. A lightly used one from BizHub was the winner with a price of \$2000. First year of maintenance is free and 25000/year copies included. Overage charge of .08/copy applies. NYS Sexual Harassment Law: each non-profit is required to have a

policy in place, report forms available and yearly employee training. A proposal was made by Eileen to temporarily adopt the NYS policy as our own, pending re-evaluation of any changes made by the state. Seconded by Mike. Carried.

New business: Cantalician Center: the Cantalician has chosen to terminate their lease at the end of November. A proposal has been made by the owners of a daycare to become a new tenant using the nursery space at a fee of \$140 per week. A state inspection is pending which will determine if any modifications need to be made to the space before certification. Motion to hold Congregational Budget meeting on 12/23 after the 9:30 service made by Debbie and seconded by Bob. Carried. Tithe.ly is a website for on line giving. The cost is 2.9% plus 30 cents per transaction. The donor can cover the cost if they want to. This will be added to the Congregational Budget meeting to see if there is any interest in the program. The board of managers has been inactive for some time where in the past they have held 3-4 meetings per year. May need to be re-organized and members re-elected. Annual disbursements to the general fund have not been made in 2 years. Motion by Dave to authorize the treasurer to withdraw \$2600 and transfer it from the annuity to the general fund. Seconded by Eileen. Carried.
